MINISTRY UPDATES

COMMUNITY MEAL - Thank you to all who deboned the chickens, donated desserts, prepared the salad, baked the biscuits, and served our families. We provided meals for 180 who came through the drive-thru, and had a few leftovers that were taken to Crossroads. It was nice to have some new volunteers from the community to help too. Minister Beth is using this opportunity to reach out and pray for all who requested support as they come to pick up their meals. "Thanksgiving" is certainly aptly put. Our meal in December will include Scalloped Potatoes with Ham, Applesauce made by our own church members on Gods Work Our Hands Sunday, Mixed Vegetables, and a Decorated Cookie with pudding. Junior High students in the classes of Christine Smith will be doing the decorating (and probably some eating too!)

GRACE'S TABLE FOOD PANTRY - Our food pantry routinely provides boxes of food items, paper items and cleaning supplies to 40-55 families monthly, with an average of 194 people. In November we served 62 families Thank you for your donations to this important ministry! It takes everyone to make it a successful ministry! Donations and helpers are always needed to keep the pantry operating. Come join us!

SEWING MINISTRY - The volunteers in the Sewing Ministry have taken a break after a very busy summer and fall. Ten of our quilts were delivered to the Sandusky warming Center just this week. Any donations of blankets, old sheets, and fabric will be put to good use once we start up again the first and third Wednesday of January-April from 9-11.

PROJECT SHARE -From November 18th to December 18th, the Fellowship Hall will be converted into an amazing, yet seemingly crazy, collection of clothing and personal items, and toys waiting to be assigned to Project Share families. In Attendance: Minister Beth Kieffer, Gary Borchardt, Dave Bodi, Jordan Kuns, Joe Greer, Joan Lander, Becky Henry, Jim Floro, Larry Krogh. The meeting was called to order by President Gary Borchardt.

The Mission Statement was recited.

Minister Beth Kieffer's devotion was taken from Isaiah 55:3. It was read from 3 different Bible versions. First reading was the 1st word that pops out which was "come to me". Second reading was the dialog which was "everlasting covenant". Third reading was think about what GOD says to you, which was "listen and receive blessings". This process is called Lectio Divina.

The minutes of the previous meeting were reviewed. There was a correction under Minister Beth's report. The word Fresh was written as Fres. Dave Bodi moved to accept the minutes, Jordan Kuns seconded the motion. Minutes were approved as corrected.

Financial Report:

The financial report was highlighted by Treasurer, Jordan Kuns.

General offerings for the month were \$15,231.00.

Permanent Improvement offerings totaled \$1,615.00.

Other giving-offering totaled \$295.00.

Operating surplus increased by \$5,052.00.

Total operating expenses for the month totaled \$13,500.00.

Jordan Kuns reported a new 11 month CD was issued for \$25,000.00, at a rate of 3.44% and end in August of 2026. This CD is staggered with the other \$30,000.00 CD.

Joan Lander moved to accept the financial report, and Larry Krogh seconded the motion. Report was approved.

Minister's Report:

Minister Beth Kieffer provided a report.

During the month of September Minister Beth said she needed another September calendar for her September calendar. She had 4 Home and 4 Hospital visits. Blessing of the Back packs, and God's Work Our Hands. Attended a Lutheran-Catholic dialog meeting, and a Synod Council meeting. Had her meeting with Pastor Chris for SAMs, and attended a SAMs meeting in Bowling Green, OH.

MINISTRY TEAM REPORTS: Stewardship & Finance:

Joe Greer had no report.

Worship:

Barb Rohrbacher reported the following:

10/05/25 Blessing of the Ouilts. There were 306 guilts made with love.

10/12/25 Blessing of the Badges. Only 1 law enforcement attended, but Over 50 congregational members stayed for breakfast and fellowship.

Thanks to all who helped, especially the Sunday School and Jean Smith.

10/26/25 Reformation Sunday, Minister Beth reminded everyone to wear Red / orange / gold

11/02/25 All Saints Sunday, Worship Committee will set up candles if Denny Loroff is unable to do.

11/23/25 CHRIŚTmas / Advent decorating after worship service.

12/24/25 Christmas Eve service @ 7:30PM / Worship Committee to prepare candles for candle-light service.

Christian Education:

Becky Henry reported:

Sunday School did well helping at the breakfast for Blessing of the Badges.

Attendance is low. There is 1 student in catechism, and 1 to 3 students in pre-catechism class. Becky stated they are hoping after Fall sports are over attendance will increase. Catechism is studying the 10 Commandments. Jean Smith contacted Minister Beth and Becky Henry in regards to the Sunday School CHRISTmas program. Since Sunday School doesn't have a lot of students in attendance, she would like to adapt a book "Callies Gift" for the CHRISTmas program which would be on December 21, 2025 during worship in lieu of the sermon.

Outreach & Social Ministry:

Joan Lander reported:

Community Meal served 175 meals at a cost of \$532.00, with \$552.00 in donations. Next Community Meal is scheduled for 11/12/25.

Pantry distributed to 51 families.

There were 306 guilts made with love

(3 to Senior Center / 10 to Warming Center / 293 to Lutheran World Relief)

Property: 3.

Larry Krogh reported that last winter there were issues with the East and West units. The West unit was used a lot, for it was the main unit used. The East unit kicked on when needed (low temperatures, storms, etc.). Repair on the West unit comes in at a cost of \$2,780.00.

He also stated in the boiler room the motor and pump need service / replaced. Since the pump was having issues and not working properly, it caused the motor to seize up. A new motor would cost \$3,610.00, but to replace the motor and the pump together costs less than \$5,000.00. Both costs include labor and service call. Replacing just one at a time would cost more because of a 2nd service call and labor. It is more cost effective to replace the motor and pump at one time. No motion is needed to move forward to repair the West unit, and purchase a new motor & pump to be installed, for they are under the money cap.

Jim Floro reported the heating registers were taken apart and cleaned. He also reported Matt Yetter re-lamped 4 lights in the back of the church. The walls will not need to be painted, just washed down.

Jim Floro reported on the elevator cables. On 6/30/25, \$3,200.00 was paid to replace the elevator cables. After contacting the company several times, the company finally came out. They went to replace the cables, and the wrong cables were ordered. They will expedite the cables and installation.

Jim also stated he has contacted 3 painters for quotes but have not received any call backs. He also contacted Sound Solutions for the sound system with no return calls to date.

Dave Bodi reported on the snow plowing. Ground Control has been contacted, but no response to date. He also reported on the back (previous front doors) will be locked during the winter months, for the steps are very icy. The side door will remain opened during the winter months.

Old Business:

Congregational meeting scheduled 11/2/25 after the worship service.

Each Committee needs to have a report for the meeting, and if a written report needs to be sent to Minister Beth or office by Monday 10/27/25.

SAM evaluation report has been completed and sent to the Synod.

New Business: 4.

Project Share donated \$1,500.00 to Grace Lutheran for use of the rooms and fellowship hall, but after discussion, Council felt the monies donated to GLC should be donated back to the community. Barb Rohrbacher suggested splitting the donation 2 or 3 ways.

Minister Beth suggested donating to the Ottawa County Advocacy, and

Barb Rohrbacher suggested Lutheran World Relief.

Jordan Kuns moved to donated \$750.00 each to Ottawa County Advocacy and \$750.00 to Lutheran World Relief. Minister Beth Kieffer seconded the motion, motion accepted.

Joan Lander asked Council for Project Share for them to use the Fellowship hall starting on 11/18/25 through mid-December (will be out before December pantry date). Joan Lander moved, Minister Beth seconded, motion accepted.

Security discussion was held due to recent nationwide events. Further discussions will be held in the future.

Adjournment:

Larry Krogh moved to adjourn, seconded by Dave Bodi. Meeting adjourned and followed by Holy Communion and the Lord's Prayer.
